#### **Food Assistance:**

- Provided food and other resources to hundreds of residents at multiple events in conjunction with Manna Food Center, Emmanuel Brinklow Seventh Day Adventist Church, Capital Area Food Bank's Senior Brown Bag, Nourishing Bethesda and My Groceries To Go programs
- Facilitated the Senior Nutrition Program, which provides meals and nutrition education for seniors in a congregate setting

#### **Youth Education/Enrichment:**

- Elementary Initiatives
  - Youth Enrichment Series after school clubs were active at Georgian Court, Tanglewood Apartments, Towne Center Place Olney and Washington Square
- Middle/High School Initiatives
  - March 6: Ninety five students participated in the Aviation Field Trip to Joint Base Andrews

## **Adult Education and Workforce Development (AEWD):**

- March 12: Paradigm Companies hosted a monthly virtual employment opportunities session
- March 21: AEWD co-hosted a Resource Fair at Tanglewood Apartments for residents of Tanglewood, Manchester Manor and Spring Gardens. Participating vendors included Montgomery County Recreation, Montgomery College Educational Opportunity Center, The Ethiopian Community Center, Gilchrist Immigrant Resource Center and We Achieve, Inc.

Financial Literacy

Financial Literacy Coach continued working with HOC's customers and individuals on the Housing Path Wait List:

- Provided one-on-one coaching to **19** HOC customers and **one** individual from the Housing Path Wait List
- Facilitated workshops for **four** HOC customers






## **Supportive Services**

- Program served 350 participants by conducting home visits, providing case management services, and paying rent and utilities
- Continued to help Emergency Voucher recipients secure housing by providing housing location services, as well as financial assistance for application fees, security deposits, moving expenses and household items
- Program staff continued to implement the Rent Supplement Program (RSP), which provides a shallow rental subsidy (up to \$600 monthly) to county residents, including a large number of seniors on fixed incomes. **280** residents participated in the program



#### Fatherhood Initiative

- March 22: The program graduated 21 fathers from the March cohort
- Twenty nine fathers are enrolled in March



Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program

- Program utilization remains at a strong 98%, above the target rate of 95%
- Currently, 76 families with issued vouchers are searching for suitable homes to rent, 156 contracts are pending execution and 150 families were selected from the HCV Wait List
- The Division received one request in March for a voucher extension beyond the initial 90-day period





## RENTCafé Supporting Online Annual Recertifications

- Overall, **402** of **623** customers submitted paperwork electronically
- **Seventy** customers were recommended for program termination effective March 1, 2024. The Resident Services Division worked in collaboration with the Housing Resources Division to assess client needs and to determine why recertifications were not being completed
- Resident Services Counselors assisted 58 families with the recertification requirement and overturned the termination. Termination proceedings will continue for 12 families who failed to respond to Counselor Outreach

Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHVs)

- HOC has an allocation of **118** Emergency Housing Vouchers
- One hundred three families have successfully leased using EHVs
- **Eleven** families have leased homes and exited the program
- One applicant is searching for a suitable home
- Three customers ported to other jurisdictions



Family Self Sufficiency (FSS)

- Current enrollment includes 363 participants
- **Two** participants graduated; one established employment with Montgomery County Public Schools, one as an independent hair consultant
- The FSS team conducted a homeownership workshop with a PNC Bank emerging markets loan officer; 55 customers participated in the event


 HOC selected JDC Construction LLC as construction manager for Phase 1 of the Wheaton Gateway Development

Water Conservation Analysis

- HOC began a water efficiency and conservation study on 14 properties
- Study is being conducted by Water Management, Inc. to identify and evaluate facilities' water usage and identify conservation and cost-saving measures
